Departure:

 - ALL animals must be released by Superintendent
 - Stalls must be cleaned of any/all shavings & manure before departure or \$50 fee.

RULES

1. Enroll in the Utility Goat Project by enrollment deadline.
2. Attend Meat Quality Assurance Training (MQA) annually.
3. Complete and file an Animal Care and Housing Form (Primary Care) on 4HOnline (leased animals and animals not housed at home must turn form into Extension Office)
4. ID all animals in 4HOnline by June 1 deadline.
5. Attend Record Book Interviews and present an up-to-date E-Record Book.
6. Enter fair classes online by entry deadline.
7. Complete and turn in the E-Record Book the Friday before Labor Day to the Extension Office. If a record book is not completed for each species exhibited, the member will forfeit premiums/awards and be ineligible to exhibit that species at the next year's Fair.



Goat Project members who intend to exhibit their animals at the Adams County Fair must complete the following to remain eligible for fair entry and exhibition:

	Enroll in the Goat Project by enrollment deadline.
	Attend Meat Quality Assurance Training (MQA) annually.
	Complete and file an Animal Care and Housing Form (Primary Care) and turn form into Extension Office.
	ID all goats in 4HOnline by applicable deadline.
	Attend Livestock Record Book Interviews and present an up-to-date E-Record Book.
	Enter fair classes online by July 1 .
	Complete and turn in E-Record Book the Friday before Labor Day to the Extension Office. If a record book is not completed for each species exhibited, the member will forfeit premiums/awards and be ineligible to exhibit that species at the next year's Fair.

DIVISION: UTILTY GOAT

Class: Trail

Saturday, July 25: 8:00AM

- Members can check in a Max of 2 individuals per class.
- Any goat can be used: Market, Dairy, or Pygmy/Dwarf, wether or doe.
- Bucks: Must be 6 months or younger
- All divisions will involve obstacles or agility courses. Goats should lead willingly around, over or through each task.
- Goats will be lead through a scenario that will re-create the coponents of a "Pack Trip" This may include Loading/Unloading from Trailer or other Travel Apparaus. May also include "natural components" such as water features, or rocky terrain.
- *Goats must show wearing packs that fit correctly & are safe. (Packs or Bags designed for people are not permitted).

DIVISION: UTILITY GOAT

Class: Obstacle

- Any goat can be used: Market, Dairy, or Pygmy/Dwarf, wether or doe.
- Bucks: Must be 6 months or younger
